


Although the day started out as overcast and rainy, participants in the 2009 Madison Area Antique and Classic Boat Show (MAACBS) tour of the Madison Lakes were very enthusiastic. The journey began with approximately 30 boats embarking from the piers at Christy's Landing mid-morning. The continued rain made it an interesting trip with the unusually low boat traffic through the river channel (imagine that). As planned, the intrepid band of boat enthusiasts made it across Lake Monona to the

Everyone took the opportunity to dry out and enjoy some great food, beverage and adult conversations (or was that adult beverages). Many discussions revolved around past boating excursions and interesting weather dilemmas. After lunch, an intense downpour



scared some back through the channel to Christy's. However, the grizzled few (8 boats) carried on to the next river channel and subsequent passage through the Tenney Locks. This route takes you into the largest body of water in the Yahara chain, Lake Mendota. Experiencing the rush of being raised and lowered a number of feet while in your boat is attention-grabbing. Having a number of classic boats going through the process is a sight-to-be-seen. It is hard to imagine this mechanical structure being built at the turn of the 20th century.



The highlight of the day for many was the arrival at the Governor's Residence. Vicki Heyman, Executive Residence Manager, gave the group a private tour of the Residence. Vicki provided much insight into all the history of the building including the various contents that have been collected over the many years of differing Governors. John Bauman even had a chance to relive the Edith Ann







The tradition continued in variety of ways for those attending the fourth annual Madison Area Antique and Classic Boat Show (MAACBS). The participants had a great time corresponding with their fellow classic boat enthusiasts and providing the public with a glimpse into the past. Friendships were renewed and new relationships were formed during the two day event on Aug. 7th and 8th.

Despite the rainy weather on Friday, over twenty boats embarked on the trip up the mighty Yahara river that runs between Lake Waubesa, Monona, and Mendota (see accompanying article). The trip is always a highlight of the show for many of the participants. On Saturday, the public showing officially began. The weather did not cooperate in the morning; however, by early afternoon the sun battled back the rain clouds and it became a glorious day.

Hundreds of spectators visited Christy's Landing to view the boats of the past. Statements about horse power, varnish techniques, hull numbers, and other restoration strategies could be heard throughout the day. The classic line..."my dad had a boat just like this one when I was growing up" was common remark on the pier. As usual, Christy's provided a great place to enjoy food and beverages while admiring the forty-plus boats in the water and on land.

On a more serious note, the MAACBS raised over \$3,000 for the Madison Multiple Sclerosis (MS) Society. This was possible because of those who brought their boats to the show which attracted the public to attend and participate in raffles, silent auctions, and donate to the cause. To date, the MAACBS has donated close to \$10,000 for the fight against MS!

5th Annual Eagle River Antique & Classic Boat Show A Success

The 5th Annual Eagle River Antique & Classic Boat Show was held June 20, 2009 on the shores of Duck and Lynx lakes at the Wild Eagle Lodge.

Antique & Classic boat shows are a rapidly growing phenomenon that attracts nostalgic enthusiasts, curious hobbyists and those who appreciate a bit of history that was nearly lost in past decades. We feel that the formula for this particular show is somewhat different. It encompasses the standard features that make a boat show a success but it goes beyond expectations for several reasons. First, and foremost, it has a broader purpose.



The organizers of the Eagle River Antique and Classic Boat Show noticed a special need in the northern section of Wisconsin. Athletes, competing in programs for those with "special needs," were poorly funded. For example, in order to participate in competitive bowling activities, the "special athletes" had to pay the weekly bowling fee out of their own pockets. This may not seem like much to most individuals however; some participants earned no more than \$1 per day at their work locations. Others labored at minimal



wage tasks. In all, the participation fees sometimes left individuals without any additional funds. The concept of donating earnings from the boat show to these athletes was established.

The Wild Eagle Lodge, a newly developed resort complex, with extensive facilities, beautiful grounds and socially conscious leaders welcomed the establishment of the boat show. Their professional staff has been given the



ability to assist in the entire effort. No request or opportunity is ever denied and the outcome has been exciting.

In its fifth annual Fathers' Day weekend event, over 50 restored boats from across Wisconsin, Illinois, Michigan, Indiana, and as far as Virginia were

displayed. The public strolled the park-like grounds and enjoyed, photographed and voted for their favorite boat shown at the event. Some marveled at the triple cockpit Chris Crafts docked side by side or the Gar Wood, Shepherd, Correct Craft, Century, Dunphy, Aristocraft and Carver boats or kayaks and canoes in the show. Proud owners shared restoration photographs and swapped stories with any who desired to relish in the rich history of the event.

A second, and most important area of support, involves the business community in the

show's general area. Many business leaders donate items to a raffle that helps to increase dollars that go to the "special" athletic programs. Participating boaters also know that net proceeds from their registration fees also go to the "cause."

Finally, volunteers make the entire process operate smoothly. Representatives from fraternal and social organizations help to coordinate launch and form docking teams, host registration tables and assist at information centers and in many other aspects of the event. Even those who



arrive with boats, planning to simply enjoy the show, get caught up in the exciting goal for the event as they donate their own time to assist in making the program an outstanding experience.

In all respects, the entire affair represents the true concept of the term "community." The "combined effort of many to reach a common goal."

At the close of the day's display, boaters joined in a floating parade and tour of some of the largest lakes on the Eagle River chain of lakes. At one point, a most impressive sight was viewed from shore and enjoyed by the captains and crews who flew, at full throttle, across the lake in a "14-boat-wide" display of huge mahogany boats. Seldom, if ever, has such an event been seen,



even in the past history of those lakes.

Saturday evening ended with a banquet at the Boondockers Lounge. The festive gathering was augmented by the presentation of awards in several categories. Raffle tickets were drawn and boaters and guests won some truly outstanding prizes. It was announced that nearly \$1,500 was anticipated for the "special athlete fund."






