





What Fun and "What-a-Guy" By Don and Bonnie Bergman


Bonnie and I have met many of our best friends through the antique boating avocation. Antique and Classic boaters not only share common interests; but also values.

The Blackhawk Chapter held a dual workshop at the Delevan Lake Boat Shed and Streblow Custom Boats Saturday April 22, 2017.

The workshop started at 10am at the **Delevan Lake Boat Shed** with coffee and doughnuts. It was estimated that about 75 people attended the informative sessions. Before the workshop, chapter members looked at vintage boats and 35 antique cars from 1925 to the 1950's. **Jameson Bradford** did hands on demonstrations on stain applications plus restoration techniques.

The group then traveled to **Streblow Custom Boats** a few miles away where a light lunch complements of the Blackhawk Chapter was served. Following lunch **Steve Horton, President of Streblow Boats** continued the education seminar/workshop. He detailed the picking of the right woods and glues used in the process. Steve went into detail about looking at each board, identifying stress areas called "wind break", linked to stability of the woods. Howard Schneider and Wil Vidal from Glacier Lakes attended the workshops. Howard said he learned some important techniques to complete the restoration of his 1961 Century Sabre.

Ever since Ole Evinrude delivered that ice cream cone to Bess, Americans have been fascinated with the outboard motor. That was evident on Saturday, May 13th when the Midwest Chapter of the Antique Outboard Motor Club Inc. held their annual Swap Meet and Show at the Okauchee Lions Park.

The weather cooperated nicely with intermittent sunshine and warm temperatures. More than 35 sellers in two rows displayed everything related to boating and outboard motors. One of the more interesting motors was the Italian-made Cary Jet circa 1963. This motor utilized a turbine below the water line which pushed water through a jet orifice propelling the boat.

Like moths to a flame you'll see crowds gather to view the new arrival's offerings hoping to get first dibs on what they brought. Tom Knuteson of Waukesha pulled in with a beautiful display of 13 Johnson outboards of various vintage and horse power.
