



NINE YEARS TO COMPLETE A 10 FOOT RACING PLAN ...and it's finally finished

A "Kit Boat Building Program" was developed in 2007 by The Antique & Classic Boat Society, Inc., to foster the teaching of boat building techniques for youth.

It started as a test at Lake George, NY with a kit boat donated by ACBS Director Jim Shotwell in the name of ACBS.

The ten-foot racing prams were an exact replica of the Chris-Craft kit offered to those wanting to build their own boat in the mid-fifties.

The Society purchased and made a number of these kits available to chapters wanting to continue or start their own youth development program, targeting middle and high-school age young adults.

The Glacier Lakes Chapter wanting to start a youth program was able to get a kit boat to start a project. A local youth group got the kit and was eager. Unfortunately, the project stalled.

A story was seen in a local Wisconsin area magazine about a group called "All Hands Boatworks". The kit boat was donated to "All Hands Boatworks" headquartered in Milwaukee, WI.

All Hands BoatWorks, Inc. exists to inspire young people challenged by socio-economic and educational hurdles to develop their skills, and self-confidence to achieve personal goals as young adults. Bill Nimke is the founder and executive leader of "All Hands BoatWorks, Inc." The program helps youth work together to build wooden boats and gain a better understanding of the building process. They learn the values of craftsmanship, academic success, learning by doing, self discipline, responsibility and teamwork.

All Hands Boatworks is a member of the Teaching with Small Boats Alliance, a professional network of more than 50 organizations and programs in the US and Canada.

This past June, Bill Nimke, founder of "All Hands Boat Works" reported that the pram was finally completed by students enrolled at the Carmen High School of Science and Technology, in Milwaukee, WI. He had a class of 12 students. It was a bit more challenging than he thought it would be, but was glad to be finally finished. The pram made its first appearance at the 12th Annual Pewaukee Antique & Classic Boat Show this August 20, 2016 on Pewaukee Lake. The Glacier Lakes Chapter will continue their support of "All Hands Boat Works".

August 12-13, 2016

August 12th and 13th saw big, enthusiastic crowds at the Door County Classic and Wooden Boat Festival in Sturgeon Bay. The weekend began Friday morning with the first annual Bay to Lake Lighthouse Cruise for registered boaters. Nine boats and crews enjoyed the event. Jon Gast of the Door County Maritime Museum started things off in the museum's lighthouse gallery with a short introduction to the lighthouses of the peninsula, and after a short skippers' meeting everyone was off to the boats for the ten mile cruise.

Once underway, the fleet headed northwest past Fincantieri Bay Ship and the giant great lakes freighters in the yard. They cruised safely past Dunlap Reef and motored out to Green Bay. The wind was steady from the northwest and kicked up a chop that made the planned run out to the Sherwood Point Lighthouse too uncomfortable to finish, but the speedy but wet run was still fun. Turning just half a mile short of the light, the fleet returned to Sturgeon Bay, passed under the famous Michigan Street Steel Bridge and slid into The Yacht Harbor adjacent to the Sturgeon Bay Yacht Club for lunch. Due to the shortened cruise, they arrived very early for the scheduled lunch and were forced to tread water at the club's bar while the lunch staff raced to get ready. The crews "struggled" through the delay at the bar prior to enjoying a great lunch.

After lunch, the second half of the cruise went exactly according to plan. Leaving the SBYC, the boats cruised southeast along Sturgeon Bay and had a chance to enjoy a high speed run from the Bay View Bridge to the entrance of the ship canal connecting the bay to Lake Michigan. They passed through the canal and gathered on the big lake just beneath the US Coast Guard Station and lights. The fleet idled there with crews snapping some great pictures. Then it was off back through the canal, a high-speed run toward the bridges and a return to the museum and festival site. After putting the boats safely away for the night, the crews met in the museum for the annual complimentary cocktail reception for registrants. Everyone had a good time getting to know the other exhibitors.

The festival's activities had begun Friday at 4pm with construction of the Sikaflex Challenge boats behind the museum. The concession stand was open and a band provided live music. A number of boats for the shore displays arrived on Friday, so there was plenty to see.

Saturday morning brought the official opening of the show with 43 boats on hand. In sizes ranging from 8' to 68' and everything from kayaks to schooners represented, boat enthusiasts had much to take in. The Maritime on Madison

street festival was underway next to the boat show grounds, regional artists displayed their work in the museum's Festival ArtMart. Door County's tall ship, Edith Becker, and the Chicago Fireboat offered cruises. Naturally, the museum was open with tours of the museum's signature ship, the tug John Purves, ongoing throughout the day. A Kahlenberg engine was on display and fired up at regular intervals, thrilling visitors. The Coast Guard Auxiliary opened the museum's 41' cutter for tours and sponsored kids activities including a Damage Control Simulator that you had to see to believe. As usual, the festival offered freshly caught local whitefish sandwiches that hungry visitors enjoyed along with ice-cold beverages. The day ended with the always entertaining Sikaflex Challenge Races and Boat Demolition Derby followed by the presentation of Peoples' Choice Awards.

Peoples' Choice Awards were awarded in several categories. The Favorite Inboard Classic award went to GLACBS members Roberta and Rich Hegy and their 2015 19' Glen L Torpedo, The Glen L. After they got soaked on the choppy cruise the day before, it was good to see the award go to them. The Favorite Classic Outboard award went to Lew and Judith Juadis of Sturgeon Bay and their immaculate 1957 18' Cruisers Inc Vacationer, Connie. The twin Johnsons were beautiful. The people awarded the Favorite Fiberglass Classic award to Jim and Tina Jordan of Algoma. Their 1969 16' Steury V-416 really looked great underway during Friday's cruise. Teddy Roosevelt was Assistant Secretary of the Navy in 1895 when Long Lake was built in upper New York State. Long Lake, an Adirondack Guideboat, was the choice for Favorite Non-Powered Craft. Her owners, John and Sandi Seaman of Sheboygan insist they are simply the current caretakers in the boat's long life. The German-built Amphicar Surf and Turf and her mermaids won the Favorite Unique Craft award. She's owned by Russ and Stacy Cihlar of Sturgeon Bay and cruised on and off to the crowd's delight past the museum during the festival. Finally, winning both the Favorite Sailboat and Best of Show awards was Rich and Nancy Kapellen's 17' Penobscot 17. They built this gorgeous boat at home in Sheboygan. The extraordinary craftsmanship was obvious to anyone who viewed her. The Museum was thrilled to host such a fine collection of boats this year.

After the presentation of awards and the show's close, participants met informally at the Sturgeon Bay Yacht Club to enjoy drinks, a Venetian Night Parade, and fireworks to top off the weekend. The Door County Maritime Museum is already looking forward to next year's event and hopes everyone who attended this year will return for more fun in 2017.

The 2017 show will take place August 11 and 12, 2017 and the festival website is already up for everyone to view. It contains news about next year and has large galleries of photos from this year's event.
