

The Fall Membership Meeting for the Glacier Lakes Chapter of the ACBS, Inc., was held Saturday, October 26, 2019 at the Cotton Exchange in Waterford, WI. Fellowship began at 5:00 pm, and by 6:05 everyone was seated, with salads served by 6:20.

After a delightful meal, outgoing Commodore Roberta Hegy welcomed everyone at 7:25 p.m. Roberta asked for any revisions to the Spring Membership Meeting Minutes. Hearing none, Roberta asked for a motion to accept the Minutes as submitted. Bill Freyman motioned for acceptance, with Bob Snyder seconding. All present so signified by saying 'Aye'.

Nancy Feichtmeier provided a Treasurer's Report, and the Chapter is very much in the black with another successful boat show generating advertising and donations. Nancy reported those donations will soon be apportioned and mailed to the recipients. Roberta asked for a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report and Bill Freyman motioned for acceptance. Bob Snyder seconded the motion, and members present so signified with an 'Aye' vote.

Gayle Ritter next spoke to Membership numbers throughout 2019, with 204 members currently active in the Chapter. She next thanked every member who attended the International Show and stated there were ten boats and 24 members who made the journey to New York state. As part of our Membership recognition, Gayle highlighted the **newest members** in attendance, **Peter and Connie Dornbach**. Perry and Jill Edwards were also recognized for their role as ambassadors for the Chapter throughout the summer at several boat show venues. Perry Edwards began, saying he and wife Jill









became members in 2011. His profession in the building trades lent itself to working on boats. He said, "The fun is in putting them together, then moving on to the next one!" Peter Dornbach explained his introduction to Glacier Lakes came about a mutual friend, Karl Johns. Peter and Connie own a Chris-Craft Cadet and shared over the years many wonderful people have entered their lives.

In Old Business, Vice-Commodore Bob Stoltz stated the Pewaukee Boat Show was again very successful in terms of both financial revenue and boater participation. Bob highlighted the tireless efforts of Wil Vidal, Co-Chair of the show and Howard Schneider for seeing the temporary piers are installed safely and in a timely manner. Linda Allen's cheerful work coordinating volunteers for the show was recognized, and for her efforts in fundraising the day of the show. Jack Schneiberg's professional skills as Treasurer for the event were highlighted, as the revenues exceeded any previous year.

Next, Bill Freyman shared of the Sturgeon Bay show, on behalf of the Door County Maritime Museum. He offered "Greetings, from the northern division" of the Chapter to much laughter. This year, 54 registered boats attended. He thanked members for their help providing rides to show goers, and for the presence of the Chapter pop-up. Next year will mark the 30th anniversary of the DCMM annual show!

Commodore Roberta shared Jane Adams and Mark Walters hope to reinstitute the Madison Area Show next year, at a potential site "Buck and Honey's" with a tentative date of August 1, 2020.

In New Business, Roberta wished to thank those many members who assisted her in the role of Commodore. Nancy Feichtmeier was recognized as "Treasurer Extraordinaire". Bob Stoltz and Wil Vidal received profuse thanks for cochairing the Pewaukee Boat Show. Finally, Roberta presented the President's Cup to Bill Freyman for his efforts promoting the mission of the Chapter throughout a large part of the







state. Congratulations and 'Thank you!' Bill. To close Roberta's tenure as Commodore, Bob Stoltz presented her with a gavel, to which she replied, "I sure could have used this the last two years!" Much laughter ensued. Thank you, Roberta for your many months of tireless and often thankless work.



Presently the logo will be embroidered, but plans are to include a lower-cost silkscreen line. Dan stated, "This is not a revenue-generating tool." Mark Willis offered a hearty, "Thank you, Dan!"

Commodore Bob Stoltz said there is currently no firm date or location for the 2020 Spring Membership Meeting. This will be discussed at the next BOD Meeting.

Following the conclusion of the Business portion of the Meeting, Bill Freyman motioned to adjourn and seconded by Bob Snyder.



# Castles, Cottages & Cruises: GLACBS Members at the 2019 ACBS International Show

The sun warmed the hearts and spirits c those who attended the 2019 ACBS International Boat Show in Alexandria Bay, NY Sept. 15 -21. The St. Lawrence River greeted attendees with rare smooth, calm waters and allowed boaters to enjoy the spectacular scenery. The trees were kissed with red and gold, the mornings were crisp and hazy. Twenty plus Glacier Lakes members (the extended Zea family made up the "plus") and eight boats made the trek from Wisconsin to New York, most arriving Sunday and others following on Monday and Tuesday.

Arrival on Sunday was a bit gloomy and drizzly but that didn't dampen the Glacier Lakes spirits! An impromptu meeting in the hotel parking lot led to boats being launched at the Riveredge Resort launch. An evening boat ride, ending at the Leppings' floating house for cocktails, kicked off the week. Monday found most of the Glacier Lakes gang aboard the Uncle Sam boat tour en route to Singer Castle on Dark Island. The castle was the "hunting retreat" for Commodore Frederick Gilbert Bourne of the Singer sewing machine family, back in the early 1900's. From the massive 5-story clock tower, to the medieval entryway with Knights of Armor standing guard, to the tipping "spy" portrait and to the many secret passageways, the group was amazed by the grandeur. A box lunch was enjoyed under sunny skies on the top deck of the Uncle Sam boat as the tour then headed to Boldt





Castle. Self-guided tours of the famed castle led to the discovery of amazing rooms, pools, gardens, towers and out buildings. A summer dream home, the Boldt Castle was built in the early 1900's by millionaire hotel magnate George C. Boldt as a tribute to his beloved wife Louise. Before its completion, Mrs. Boldt passed away unexpectedly and the inconsolable Mr. Boldt immediately stopped all construction leaving the property vacant for over seventy years. Graffiti and vandalism can still be found on the upper stories of the castle, while the lower level has been restored to the grandeur of the golden age of the Thousand Islands. A quick boat trip took people to the amazing Boldt boat house where museum quality boats are displayed. Another evening boat ride for some ended the day, enjoying the sunset (and cocktails) back at the Leppings' floating house.

Tuesday was an adventurous boat ride around Wellesley Island. The Glacier Lakes gang joined 284 passengers in 65 boats on a tour of the Thousand Islands area. Castles and cottages dotted the islands. "The Narrows" were navigated one boat at a time and under water waterfalls created crazy currents, turning boats one way and then another. The wide open stretches of the river allowed for those craving speed to "open 'er up"! The evening was spent at the Bonnie Castle Resort at a reception hosted by the Thousand Islands Chapter. The day's stories were re-told and the bright orange sunset was admired.

The Antique Boat Museum (ABM) in Clayton was on the docket for Wednesday. For those who chose to arrive by boat, the 45 minute ride was delightful and the huge freighter that shared the St. Lawrence River was truly something to marvel at. The ABM is an amazing place with several different buildings filled with magnificent classic and antique boats. A special treat was the warehouse that was open just for ACBS mem-



bers. Boats and motors of all sizes, in all shapes and in different stages of repair/restoration are stored here. A short walk from the ABM and you found yourself at the ACBS offices, as well as the quaint downtown shopping area. The official kick-off to the show was held at the Antique Boat Museum Wednesday evening with music, food, drink and tours.

Thursday dawned to round table meetings which several of our Glacier Lakes members The takeaways were fantastic attended. regarding membership involvement and retention. It was also a day to get one's boat ready for the show and perhaps judged. There were 151 boats registered for the show with docks at the Riveredge Resort and at the city docks, a 10 minute walk away. The show, held Friday and Saturday, couldn't have been better! Lots of sun, little wind and tons of laughter. Wood shined and chrome gleamed. Following Friday evening's scholarship dinner, the town of Alexandria Bay delighted everyone with fireworks over the St. Lawrence River with the Boldt Castle as a backdrop. It was truly magical and a wonderful way for Alexandria Bay to say thank you to show participants. Class awards were given out Saturday morning at a breakfast and the show wound down Saturday evening with an awards dinner. Our Glacier Lakes crew took home a "boat load" of silver awards. Way to go! John Zea won the "best engine" award. (A complete list of winners, as well as show and meeting articles, can be found in the 2019 fall edition of The Rudder magazine.) The Glacier Lakes members found themselves saying good bye to new friends with promises to stay in touch. Sunday found Glacier Lakes members back on the highway waving to each other as they passed each other. The cars and trailers scattered as some stopped at Niagara Falls for a day's detour, while others headed back to Wisconsin, stopping overnight. If you've never attended an ACBS International Boat



Show, I recommend that you do. The boats are eye candy, the people are the best and events (especially the pre-events) are outstanding. Just ask anyone who attended this year's show!
