

Roberta introduced our guest speaker – Tim Hoffmann, USCGA – who presented an informative series about water safety and regulations. Key takeaways include, but not limited to:

- classic boats are regulated the same as any modern vessel.
- Federal regulations apply to large bodies of water & their tributaries. Lake Michigan is just such a large body of water, and the Milwaukee River is a tributary. Therefore, all applicable regs for Lake Michigan also apply to the Milwaukee River. Consult online governmental websites for complete details!
- All passengers 13 years of age or under are required by Federal law to wear a USCG approved lifejacket. Be aware of the correct number required on your vessel, and appropriate size for your guests!
- Keep a 'throwable' readily available.
- 50' of poly line specific to marine use is also required on board your vessel.
- Boating under the influence could potentially result in two tickets. Be cautious!
- NO WAKE is the slowest possible speed at which a vessel can maintain steerage.

Great outline, Tim! We thank you for your service and help in keeping our waters safe.

Following the presentation, Roberta thanked everyone for attending and we concluded at 8:12 pm.

After becoming official "Snow Birds" last year, we thought Florida and the Tavares Sunnyland Boat Show with the St. John's River Cruise were in order for 2019. Other things on our "Bucket List" included the "Florida Jets" radio-controlled model jet aircraft show in Lakeland, a trip to the Kennedy Space Center to watch a launch, and revisit the newly renovated "Downtown Disney" now called "Disney Springs". Not to mention getting in some golf. We rented a condo in a very nice complex on the St. John's River in Welaka for the month of March. It had great floating docks and a beautiful view of the river.

The river cruise and Tavares show were later in the month, so we got in some golf during the first couple weeks and spent a day at the Kennedy Space Center. A special thank you to Bob Stoltz for putting together this unique opportunity to get a first hand tour from one of the founders, Peter Harken and a Glacier Lakes member and supporter.

Peter Harken had just returned from a Executive Committee trip in Europe Friday afternoon when he met with Glacier Lakes members Saturday morning March 16 at World Headquarters at One Harken Way, Pewaukee, Wisconsin.

Like many entrepreneurial startups, the forerunner to Harken, Vanguard Boats (a builder of Olympic class racing dinghies) started in a garage. According to an earlier story in another publication, the decor included a shared typewriter, telephone and file cabinet. Too poor to afford an apartment, Peter and Olaf slept and entertained in the building, with guests often complaining about how itchy the fiberglass made them. A big break came from Peter and Olaf's landlords, LeRoy and Al Stippich, owners of Accurate Products, a tool and die business in Waukesha. The Stippichs felt a kinship with Peter and Olaf because they had been just as broke when they were strating out. Leroy and Al provided free tooling for the blocks with ther innovative ball bearings.

Providentially, Gary Comer, president of Lands End, had promised to include them in his catalog if they could deliver right away. Thanks to Accurate, they did. Then the blocks were used by t w o gold medalists in

the Olympic Games. The rest, of course, is history.

Harken has been in their new facility for six years, has seven interational subsidiaries celebrated their 50th Anniversary in 2018.



# Don & Mary Schwister... People who made a difference By Howard Schneider


First a little history about the boat show piers. When the boat show moved from the yacht club to it's present location in the village we obviously needed some kind of pier to dock the boats. We entered into an agreement with Mod U Dock to provide us with a 4' wide pier we would connect to the new ski club pier which was also provided by Mod U Dock. That year we assembled the floats and 4' x 8' pier sections at Mod U Dock, loaded them onto trailers, brought them to the show site, hand carried them down to the lake where we bolted them together for the show. When the show was over we reversed the procedure taking the pier sections back to Mod U Dock and unloading them. During the show that year it became apparent that a 4' wide pier wasn't going to do the trick, so the next year we went to 6'x6' pier sections which were a lot more stable with a crowd of people on them. We still had to hand load them at Mod U Dock, assemble them in the lake, then hand load them back onto the trailers where we once again unloaded them for storage at Mod U Dock While we were all thinking "I'm glad we don't have to do this for another year" Don was thinking how can we make this easier and more efficient. Don proceeded to do just that. Using his years of experience and connections as a structural steel contractor Don unitized the 6' sections into 18' sections which we now set with a crane. With Don's typical attention to detail he even had the signs and radios for traffic control when we were using the crane. Don had all the sections numbered and set on two trailers that Don and Mary donated to the club. Not only did they provide the trailers they provided a place to store them. In subsequent years Don worked to further refine the piers by installing the pivoting aluminum on ramp and the off ramps provided by John Zea. So this year when you walk on that pier and your backs not hurting from helping put it together give some thought to two people who made a differ ence Don & Mary Schwister.

Mary also handled all the publicity and started the Veterans Closing Ceremony program.
