
Glacier Lakes Chapter Lost Great Friends of the Hobby this Past Year

Gordon is survived by his wife Judy who after 64years of marriage he still called "the love of his life", his son Jeffrey (Tami), his son-in-law Bobby Levy. His Grandchildren Ashley Levy Lunsford (Wes), Rachel Moore Taylor (Adam), and Zach Moore (Meghan). His brother Jay Moore (Lin). He also leaves behind 6 great granddaughters. After graduating from Indiana University, he went on to join the United States Air Force where he earned the rank of First Lieutenant as an instructor on T33 jets in the Air Force flight school.

He started his civilian career in 1958 with General Electric as a sales trainer remaining there for his entire 30 year career, reaching the level of Manager for the Consumer Electronics Division for RCA/General Electric.

His retirement centered around his four loves; his wife Judy, his children, antique cars, and wooden boats. Even in retirement he found a source to which he could channel his energy and knowledge when he started "The Minocqua Antique Boat & Car Show". Gordon was first introduced at the age of 9 to Lake Minocqua when his parents rented the house on Jossarts Island for the summer.




In memory of Karl Johns; father, friend, antique collector, and so much more......

27th Annual Door County Classic and Wooden Boat Festival

With over 40 boats to view both in the water and ashore, kids' activities, the Boathouse Sale of used maritime treasures, the museum and its displays, and of course the Sikaflex Challenge Boatbuilding Contest, the festival was a fun time for all.

Unfortunately, the pre-event cruise scheduled for Friday, The Bay to Lake Lighthouse Cruise, didn't take place as the Coast Guard posted small craft warnings for the day due to windy conditions. Eleven boats had registered for the cruise. Their crews still enjoyed a guided tour of the 100 year-old John Purves, the museum's signature tug, lunch at the Sturgeon Bay Yacht Club, a docent led tour of the museum, and the complimentary cocktail reception that evening.


Glacier Lakes members should know that the chapter was extremely well represented this year by Dan Holdmann. Not only did Dan and the family bring their boat to display at the festival, but Dan and his son Eli joined the Sikaflex Challenge! Yes, they dug in, sawed away, got covered in Sikaflex glue and paint, and raced their boat in the time trials on Sunday. Hundreds of spectators found Dan and Eli irresistible and they were clearly the emotional favorites of the contest.

According to Dan, he and Eli didn't work out any construction details prior to the start of the event. They simply got creative and got to work. The red, white, and blue boat they named Jett, featured watertight compartments (we think), and personalized rowing stations. "Daddy" was to starboard; "Eli" was to port. Bill Freyman loaned them a GoPro camera to mount on the foredeck to record the effort.

Eleven teams participated. They earned points by building the boat quickly, finishing the on-water course fast, and by the number of votes they received for theme/decoration. One Coast Guard entry sank during the race. Dan and Eli were fast around the course, but were only able to place 10th. Their build time left something to be desired in terms of speed. But the crowds were loud and enthusiastic cheering Dan and Eli on during the event. Their high-five at the end said it all. The GLACBS team didn't participate in the final traditional boat "demolition derby." Eli, now a Sikaflex veteran, wanted to take Jett home.

So congratulations to Dan and Eli. Way to go, guys! Everyone should plan to attend the 28th annual Door County Classic and Wooden Boat Festival next year, because Dan and Eli are already planning their comeback. Let's cheer them on. Forward, GLACBS!
