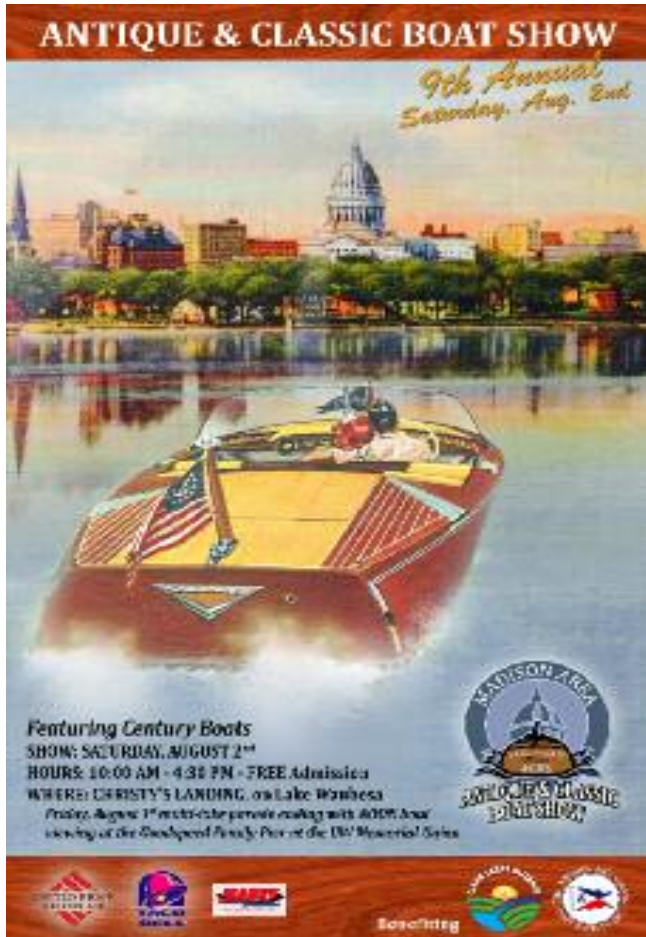

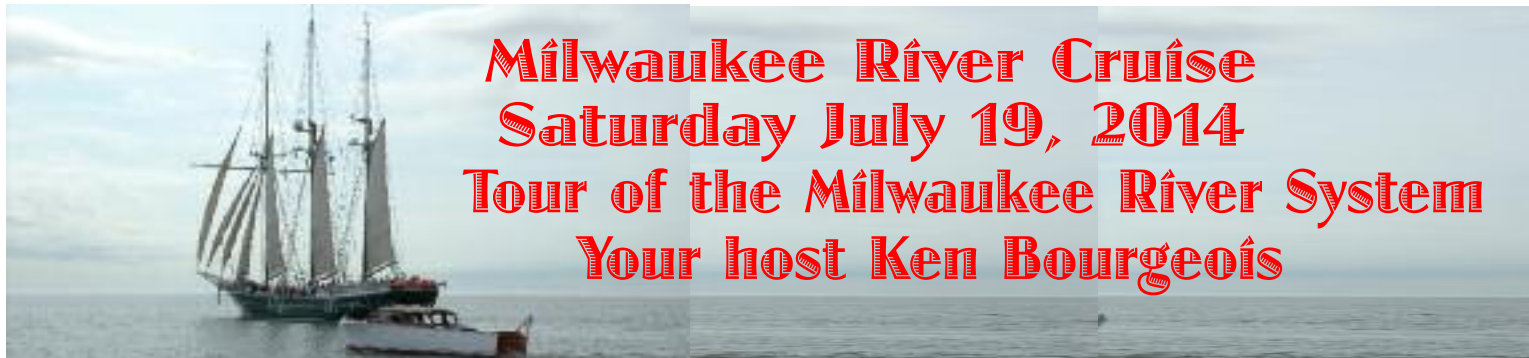

Coast Guard Regulations for the day

SAFETY AND REGISTRATION: State Registration documents on board with proper numbers on your boat. One PFD for each person onboard plus one throwable. One orange flag plus Flares (check the expiration date). One Fire Extinguisher for boats with inboards. A horn or other sound producing device. Flame arrestors for gasoline engine boats built after April 25, 1940. Blowers are required for gasoline engine boats built after July 31, 1980. Navigation lights for after sunset. I would like to stress that the no wake rule is in effect in all areas of the inner harbor, all the rivers, and the breakwater exits to the open lake.

Boat to boat communication: If you have a marine radio please bring it I think we can use channel 68. If you do not have a radio I will need a cell phone number for each boat. My number is 414-322-5841.

I am trying to arrange for overnight trailer storage for those that will be staying over into Sunday.

At this time safe storage for boat and trailer is \$16.00

Rich Lepping received a call from Bon-Ton stores looking for an old boat for a photo shoot. **The Bon-Ton Stores, Inc.**, is a regional department store company based in York, Pennsylvania, chiefly operating 275 stores, including 11 furniture galleries, in 23 states. Monona will include a tour of UW campus, lunch at Memorial Union Terrace, excursion to Nauti-Gal. Friday night fish boil at Christy's, Saturday boat show.

D) Pewaukee Boat Show: August 16. Wil Vidal showed the poster for this year, and added that John Constable has designed and made stickers designating our 10th anniversary. He asked for anyone interested in advertising, suggestions for a feature boat, and ideas on how to commemorate our 10th anniversary. The Pewaukee Arts Council may be commissioned to paint individual boats. Jane Larson volunteered to do PR for the Pewaukee Boat show and also help with editing the newsletter.

E) Swap meet May 17. See newsletter for details.

Roberta Hegy's Presentation on the building of a Glen L "Torpedo"

One of Roberta Hegy's goals was to build a mahogany boat. She previously built two airplanes. She has retired from active flying and aircraft ownership.

Roberta made contact with the Glacier Lakes Chapter at the Milwaukee Boat Show in 2011. Roberta liked what she saw and joined the chapter. Roberta has become very active and is now a Director. Roberta started building her first boat in 2010 and finished it in 2011. That boat is a Glen L Zip which is a 14.5 ft outboard runabout. Her second boat is a 10 ft outboard hydroplane, called the Glen L Super Spartan, that she built for her two grandchildren. Roberta is now in the process of building a new Glen L design called the "Torpedo". It is a 19.5 ft inboard single cockpit runabout reminiscent of the older Ventnors.



Roberta's presentation focused on building a "Torpedo". She showed photographs and explained the building process of the Glen L "Torpedo". This is being done in several segments. The presentation included frame building, laminating motor stringers, setting up on the building form, setting the keel and other longitudinals, drilling the prop shaft hole, fairing the boat for planking, and cold molded double diagonal planking with plywood. Roberta's presentation and knowledge was nothing short of amazing.

Dear Mr. Walters,

Thank you for your email requesting legislation related to the registration of antique boats. We are researching current law to see if there are provisions that could be adapted to antique boats. We did review current law related to antique motor vehicles. Based on the information on your website, it seems that the owners of antique boats do use them for recreational purposes. However, the current statute for antique vehicles limits their usage to special occasions or travel to/from maintenance or storage facilities. The payment of the initial registration fee and the requirement for no renewal fee to be paid is justified by the extremely limited use on the roadways.

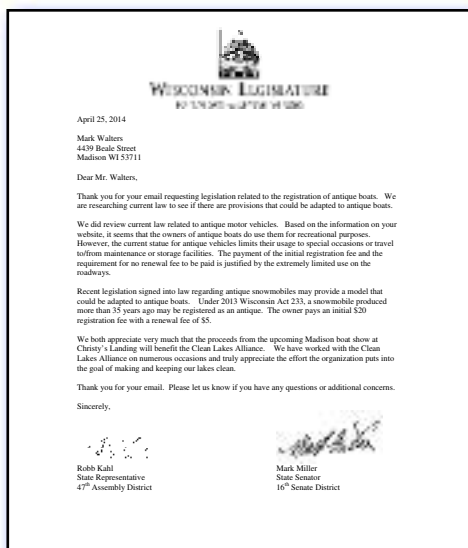
Recent legislation signed into law regarding antique snowmobiles may provide a model that could be adapted to antique boats. Under 2013 Wisconsin Act 233, a snowmobile produced more than 35 years ago may be registered as an antique. The owner pays an initial \$20 registration fee with a renewal fee of \$5.

We both appreciate very much that the proceeds from the upcoming Madison boat show at Christy's Landing will benefit the Clean Lakes Alliance. We have worked with the Clean Lakes Alliance on numerous occasions and truly appreciate the effort the organization puts into the goal of making and keeping our lakes clean.
