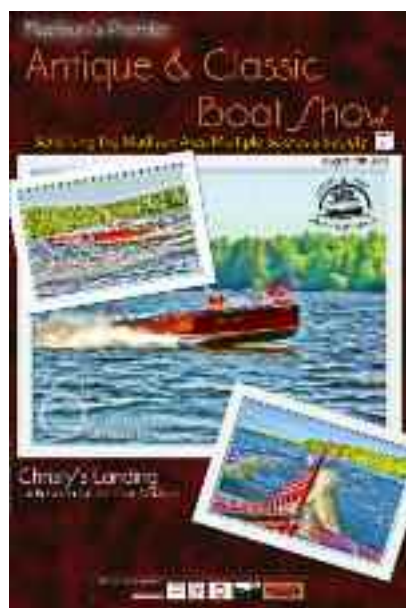

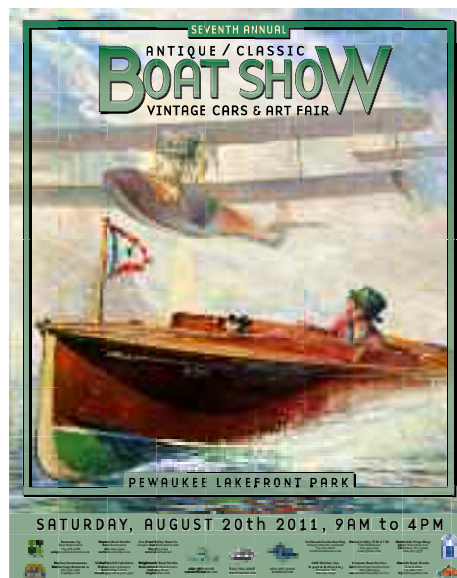

The meeting was held at Carp's Landing in Lake Mills, WI. After dinner, Commodore Mark Walters passed out the meeting agenda and called the meeting to order at 7:08 PM. He promised it would be a quick meeting.

Review of Past Minutes: The minutes from the winter dinner meeting at the Delafield Brewhaus in Delafield on January 6, 2011 were printed on the back of the agenda. Motion was made by Bob Stoltz to approve the minutes and was seconded by Rich Lepping. Motion carried.

International Boat Show 9/23-9/25/11: Mark Walters reported that a meeting was held with members of the Blackhawk Chapter regarding planning the show. Mark, Rich Lepping, and Wil Vidal represented Glacier Lakes. Mark stated that the Blackhawk Chapter was looking at creating volunteer coordinators and that Glacier Lakes would participate in finding/selecting individuals. Volunteer opportunities for all will be identified in the coming weeks.

Milwaukee Boat Show 1/21-1/30/11: John Bauman gave an update on this years show, and stated that the show promotor want us back next year. The Glacier Lakes display presented very well and generated a lot of traffic through our area. Rich Lepping thanked John for scheduling coverage on all shifts in the 10-day show, and a special thanks was extended to Frank and Helen Petran and Karl Johns for their dedication and hard work, attending the show every day.

Treasurer's Report: Mark Walters (for Mary Willis) reported that the current balance in our checking account is \$2,082.96 as of 4/14/11. With a couple donations to the pier fund from Karl & Sue and Wil and Mary, the balance on the pier purchase is now \$13,257. On the question of whether to raise our dues from \$15/year which was brought up at our last meeting, Mark stated that we have been running a deficit of approx. \$350/year for the last couple years. The average dues paid by all U.S. chapters of ACBS, as of January, 2008, are \$19.80/year. Rich

Karl Johns Summer Outing: Karl stated that the event will be held on Saturday, July 16 at his home on Okauchee Lake. It will be catered, and the cost will be \$20/person. He expects about 30 cars and 20-25 boats. Parking will be at Karl's and at Weissgerber's Golden Mast. Beer, soda and ice will be provided, BYO liquor. The deadline for reservations will be about 10 days prior, July 7. Details will be in the April/May/June newsletter.

Show Reports:

PEWAUKEE: Wil reported on the Pewaukee Show, to be held on August 20, 2011. We are having our first official meeting to plan the show at the Vidal home on Saturday, 4/23 at 9AM, and all are invited to attend. It promises it to be another great show.

MADISON SHOW: Mark Walters stated that the Madison Boat Show will be held on August 5-6, 2011 at Christy's Landing on Lake Waubesa. They had a planning meeting March 17th. The agenda will be similar to last year's with some additions: Friday AM put boats in, lakes tour including possible stops at the governor's mansion, UW, Porter Boathouse, and Friday night fish fry at Christy's. Information on all shows will be in the next newsletter.

Membership Status: Gayle Ritter stated that our membership is up to 147 family units this year, including two from California.

Miscellaneous:

A) Fall Banquet/Meeting: Mark asked for suggestions on where and when to hold the meeting. Discussion followed: should there be a boating activity in addition to dinner? Football season will be a factor, and if it's in October, the weather will be a factor. Wil suggested the Delafield Brewhaus since we will be selling their beer at the Pewaukee Boat Show. Although no decision was made, folks were enthusiastic about holding the banquet at Brewhaus.

B) Chapter tent: Karl Johns has had the broken poles replaced and Harken Canvas has repaired the damaged tent. Wil stated that St. Anthony's Men's Club has a tent for sale that can be configured into 3 different sizes, and is in good shape. It is priced at \$300 and will fit our (future) needs. 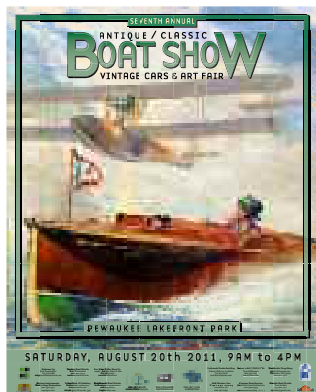

The Restoration of “Miss Gimlet”, a 16’ 1953 Dunphy Muskie

EDITORS NOTE: Kurt and Carol Rothe spend their winters in Tavares Florida and summers in Omro, WI. Kurt has been the Sunnyland Chapter’s Newsletter Editor for the Sheerline for the past five years. This story appeared in the winter 2011 issue of The Sheerline.

In my usual manner of trying to find a boat to restore, I was reading all of the “classified ads” in our local newspaper when what should appear but a 16’ 1953 Dunphy Muskie. Sixteen footers are hard to find and I instantly became interested in looking at the boat. The boat was for sale in Neenah, Wisconsin, just up the road a piece from where we were living in Oshkosh, Wisconsin, in 2005. The boat was an open three-seat utility and was not in the best of shape. I had the idea that I wanted, for the first time, to turn the boat into more of a custom outboard runabout. So what happened was “the molded plywood guy” (me!!!) purchased the boat and antique Tee Nee Trailer to restore it into a boat that my wife would enjoy!

Now designing and restoring a boat that my wife would enjoy are the key issues to this whole project. Carol loves to sit in the front lounge of our pontoon boat (perish the thought of having a pontoon boat in a wooden boat family) and see the water directly. In her words, she “wants to bond with nature and scenery” and does not like to look over the bow but enjoys looking directly AT the water. Well, how do we begin to tackle this issue?

We talked about windshield placement and she informed me that she did NOT want to have to look through a windshield like in a car. That would not do! I was surfing the internet one day looking for possible stories to publish in the Sheerline when I ran across a restoration done by the Macatawa Bay Woodworks in Michigan. They had taken a 1948 Dunphy cedar strip runabout and placed the windshield on the middle deck of the boat leaving the front cockpit open for viewing. Walla!!!! I had found my answer to the challenge at hand. So my intention was to slightly alter the Dunphy utility and redesign it into a two seat runabout with a mid deck for a windshield and a front seat with great viewing potential to directly see everything in front of the bow. Challenge met—so I thought!!!

I began the restoration process in late 2006 by first removing the seats and other internal mahogany from the boat. Next I wanted to strip the old paint off the floor and what a job that was. I don’t know what kind of paint they used in 1953 but I swear that it had a special type of bonding

characteristic because it really penetrated the plywood. First I tried the standard paint and varnish remover! No luck! Then I tried some "heavy duty" remover! Still no luck! Then I applied some special remover recommended to me by a local boat restorer! And still no luck! Finally it was time to return to Florida and I visited with Tom Flood at the "Temple" and he strongly recommended using "Dad's Paint and Varnish Remover." I found that the "True Value" stores carried the product but it had to be "special ordered" as they did not stock it. Of course I ordered a gallon. It worked as I was finally able to remove most of the old varnish. What was left had to be sanded off but that was an easy task compared to working with the different kinds of varnish removers.

By now it was in mid-summer of 2007 and I had just finished removing the paint from the floor of the inside of the hull. After flipping the boat over with the help of good neighbors, on we went to the outside of the hull. To my amazement I encountered the same problem with removing the old paint so out came the "Dad's" and it worked swimmingly.

Then I decided to "fair off" the rough spots with fairing compound and then West epoxy on the entire bottom. After applying the epoxy and also after more sanding, I applied 3 coats of white Interlux primer and then 3 coats of Interlux "Sea Green" which finished off that part of the boat.

Next came the challenge of restoring the decks. I used white oak for the frames and covered them with quarter inch marine plywood which was fastened to the deck with "5200" and stainless steel screws. After the decks were built, I installed 3/16" mahogany over the plywood securing it with West epoxy. All wood was given a coat of CPES before installation.

I had to reconstruct the seats and also the mahogany gunnels. Interlux Chris Craft Red Mahogany stain was applied followed by a coat of CPES and then 10 coats of Captain's Varnish. I also installed stainless on both the gunnels and rub rails.

The sides of the boat were done in Interlux "Grand Banks Beige" for contrast. All in all, I am quite pleased with the project. My wife is happy as she now can "bond with nature" next summer! In fact, after she saw how much I enjoyed working in the garage restoring the boat, she became worried that I would not have enough to do next summer and encouraged me to find another project. I did—a 1948 Chris Craft 17' Deluxe.

After approaching about a dozen model builders, we finally found someone willing to take on the Shooting Star model project. His name is Doug Dixon of Tacoma, WA. He did his work entirely off pictures. He had never seen a Shooting Star in person. The quality, workmanship and level of detail is truly incredible....the bow/stern lights(glow sticks) work and there is a flip down rear seat, just like the actual boat. The speedometer, Atwood bow light, hatch cover handles and transom hardware was all custom cast. The steering wheel turns and the control box handles move. The stitching on the seats is perfect! Needless to say, I'm very pleased with the end result. Doug initially made a prototype....he then tweaked it a bit and made three additional models simultaneously....all three were presold. He estimates that each model took between 350-400 hours to build. As you can imagine, these were not inexpensive....in fact, the model cost approximately what the real boat did, back in 1957. The model is powered by a vintage K&O Mark 75. I am currently having a real Mark 75 restored to put on my Shooting Star.
