9:00---10:00 Launch at South Shore Park launch ramp

10:30--- Gather at the Discovery World Lagoon

11:00--- Leave for the inner harbor and proceed under the Hoan Bridge 11:00---12:00 tour the Milwaukee River (comfort stop along the way)

12:00---1:00 the Kinnickinnic River

1:00--- 3:00 the Menomonee River with a stop for lunch at The Horny Goat Pub

(All times are approximate and all other plans depends on the weather)

At this time we plan on at least two stops, one will be a short rest stop along the Milwaukee River (possible The Ale House) this depends on available dock space the second will be at The Horny Goat for lunch. More information about these things on the day of the outing.

Coast Guard Regulations for the day
SAFETY AND REGISTRATION: State Registration documents on board with proper numbers on your boat. One PFD for each person onboard plus one throwable. One orange flag plus Flares (check the expiration date). One Fire Extinguisher for boats with inboards. A horn or other sound producing device. Flame arrestors for gasoline engine boats built after April 25,1940. Blowers are required for gasoline engine boats built after July 31,1980. Navigation lights for after sunset. I would like to stress that the no wake rule is in effect in all areas of the inner harbor, all the rivers, and the breakwater exits to the open lake.

Boat to boat communication: If you have a marine radio please bring it I think we can use channel 68. If you do not have a radio I will need a cell phone number for each boat. My number is 414-322-5841. Ken Bourgeois

VARNISH 201 ADVANCED TOPICS IN VARNISH, PAINT PREP & APPLICATION Saturday March 21, 2015, 9:30am - 1:00pm South Shore Yacht Club, Milwaukee, WI PRESENTED BY Mary Richter of Fine Yacht Finishing and Scott Bruesewitz



A special thank you to **Mary Richter** of Fine Yacht Finishing and **Scott Bruesewitz**, for presenting another well prepared seminar on varnishing, paint preparation proven applications for working with wood and fiberglass. Mary and Scott are very involved members of The Glacier Lakes Chapter and The South Shore Yacht Club. It was held at the South Shore Yacht Club in Bay View, WI Saturday March 21, 2015. Registration started at 9:30am and went to about 1:30PM. This was a 4th presentation put on by either Scott and Mary or both in tandem. Scott had done some earlier seminars focusing on fiberglass. About 60 attendees came armed with note pads and questions. Mary and Scott were prepared with a take home 14 page outline for attendees, slides, demonstrations, product samples and of course coffee and donuts.

They talked about planning your project, the importance of safety, specialty tools for removing old finishes, and how to use a heat gun and tips for effective sanding wood and fiberglass. They covered the repairing of dings, dealing with stress cracks in wood and fiberglass. After a break Mary and Scott discussed the cleaning of wood and fiberglass for painting, staining and varnishing.

They talked about different brands of products. They stressed that it is important to follow specific manufacturer instructions when using different products. If a manufactures say use one to one, that is what

one should do. They also talked about the importance of using the right breathing mask protection equipment. And finally, don't despair. If something doesn't turn out right, you can do it again. One attendee remarked that they should have charged a lot more considering the knowledge Scott and Mary shared. The nominal fee covered cost of coffee, donuts and use of the yacht club room and staff for setup and take down of chairs. You can access Mary Richter's website at: www.fineyachtfinishing.com

After the presentation, a number of individuals approached yours truly about joining the chapter. They were John Czeszak of Milwaukee and Rick and Amy Cermak of Racine, WI. John is interested in making a vintage boat purchase and Rick and Amy own a 1957 Carver Captain. Scott Bruesewitz can be credited for bringing in a number of new members.

Mary's take home information outline had these words of wisdom:
