The ACBS Annual Meeting and Boat Show will come to Milwaukee in 2017

Rich Lepping presented background information to chapter members at The Delafield Brewhaus Chapter banquet Friday November 20, 2015.

After getting initial Chapter Board approval, Rich Lepping made a proposal at the June 2015 ACBS Board meeting in Mystic Seaport to sponsor the Antique & Classic Boat Society, Inc., (ACBS) International Meeting & Boat Show at The Madison Edgewater for 2018. Lake Tahoe would host the event in 2016 and The Antique Boat Museum in Clayton, NY would host it in 2017. As all Glacier Lakes members know, every year the August Madison Boat Show includes a pre-event trip on Waubesa, Monona, and Mendota lakes, including a stop at The Student Union.

A new pier system had been completed at The Edgewater Resort, the proposed site for the 2018 ACBS Meeting and Boat Show. This past August the Madison (MAACBS) pre-cruise included a trip to The Edgewater Resort and docking at the new pier system. It turned out that the wind conditions made it almost impossible to dock. It became a huge concern for the protection of antique and classic boats. Rich told ACBS that he wanted to put the Madison 2018 proposal on hold to further research on how to make the dockage safe for everyone in the event of bad weather. In the meantime, The Antique & Classic Boat Society decided that the Clayton location wouldn't be ready for 2017. The new ACBS President of the Antique & Classic

Boat Society, Inc.,(ACBS) asked newly elected Vice-President Rich Lepping if the Glacier Lakes Chapter could host a venue in 2017. Knowing that The Edgewater would need long term research, Rich made contacts with Lake Lawn Lodge, South Shore Yacht Club and The Milwaukee Yacht Club. Lake Lawn wants the show, South Shore Yacht Club said no as well as The Milwaukee Yacht Club initially saying probably not. The Milwaukee Yacht Club called back while Rich was conferring with the board on what was happening. The MYC decided they wanted the event.

An initial meeting was held November 6 at The Milwaukee Yacht Club. Those in attendance included: Glacier Lakes members: Rich Lepping, Ken Bourgeois, Marc Daniloff, Nancy Feichtmeier, Roberta Hegy, Jane Larson, Sue Rechcygl, Jack Schneiberg, Howard Schneider, Mark & Mary Willis, Wil Vidal, and Jeff Stebbins, Due Diligence Representative from The Antique & Classic Boat Society, Inc.

Also present were Thomas Maliszko, General Manager, MYC; and Dan Couillard, Dockmaster , MYC. Also at the meeting from Visit Milwaukee were Megan Husband, Convention Sales Manager, and Lynne Sobczak, Convention Services Manager.

It became apparent by looking at the piers, that the biggest concern was the ability of some of the pier system heights not being able to accommodate the boats of the ACBS organization. Rich emphasized that this would need to be corrected. Another meeting has been scheduled to also meet with Milwaukee County representatives. Parts of their pier system would accommodate the needed adaptability for ACBS antique & classic boat owners. Rich feels confident that MYC will do whatever it takes to make it work

A successful event will take the hard work of many Glacier Lakes members. Rich will be in contact with the Blackhawk Chapter to do partnering. Rich said that The Chapter will plan a preevent agenda from Monday September 10, 2017 to Wednesday September 13, 2017. This is in the planning stage. Rich emphasized that we must resolve the dock situation before we can plan anything else. Rich noted that this will be the first ACBS International event to be held in a major city. More to come



Early Friday morning, the trailers start arriving. Glacier Lakes members bring two trailers with the piers. Everything is lined up along Wisconsin Ave. Safety precautions with warning barriers are put in place. Members at each end of street get ready to direct traffic. The Dawes crane will arrive about 8:00AM. The piers are lifted off the trailers and set in the lake. A crew links the piers and connects the system into the Pewaukee Ski Club dock. All this takes about 90 minutes. On Sunday morning, everything is done in reverse.
